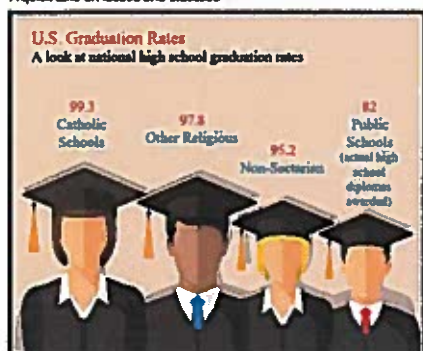
Celebrate Catholic Schools Week 2018

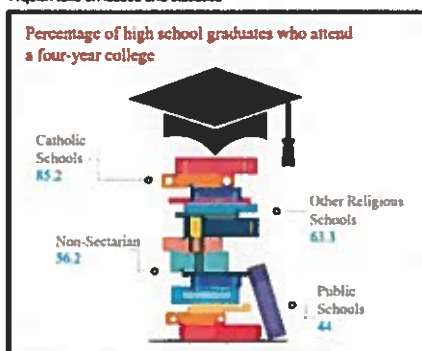

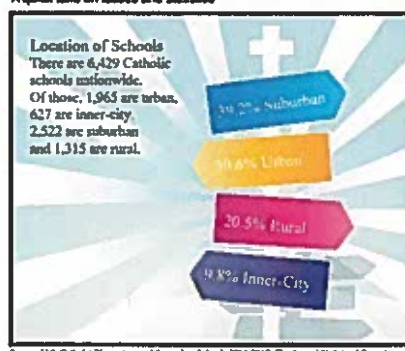

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Dear Parent or Guardian:

Cold and flu season is upon us and we are seeing a number of students with flu symptoms. To prevent widespread flu in the school, we recommend that your child stay home from school if experiencing flu or cold symptoms. To decide whether or not to send your child to school, please consider the following guidelines.

Consider keeping your child at home for an extra day of rest and observation if he or she has any of the following symptoms:

- Very stuffy or runny nose and/or a cough
- Mild sore throat (no fever, no known exposure to strep)
- Headache
- Mild stomach ache

Definitely keep your child at home and consider seeking medical attention if he or she has any of these symptoms:

- Fever (greater than 100 degrees by mouth. Your child may return to school only after his or her temperature has been consistently below 100 degrees, by mouth, for a minimum of 24 hours)
- Vomiting (even once)
- Diarrhea
- Chills
- General malaise or feelings of fatigue, discomfort, weakness or muscle aches
- Frequent congested (wet) or croupy cough
- Shortness of breath
- Significant nasal congestion with frequent clearing of nose

To help prevent the flu and colds, teach your children good hygiene habits:

- Wash hands frequently
- Do not touch eyes, nose or mouth
- Cover mouth and nose when sneezing or coughing, use a paper tissue, throw it away and then wash hands
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick

The flu shot is one of the best ways to prevent illness from the seasonal influenza virus. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends adults and children receive the flu vaccine each year. Yearly flu vaccination is needed because immunity against the flu wears off over time. In addition, the flu virus strains often change, so the vaccine also changes from year-to-year in order to match the flu viruses expected to be circulating in the community.

Colds and Flu are the most contagious during the first 48 hours. A child who has a fever should remain at home until "fever free" for a minimum of 24 hours.

Often when a child awakens with vague complaints (the way colds and flu begin), it is wise to observe your child at home for an hour or two before deciding whether or not they should attend school. Your child should be physically able to participate in all school activities upon return to school. Keeping a sick child at home will help minimize the spread of infections and viruses in the classroom.

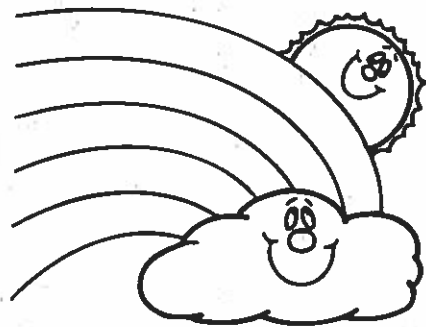

DO WE UNDERSTAND THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS?

LENT. We often associate Lent a number of ways: ashes, no meat on Friday, penances, purple, etc. Then there are the Stations of the Cross. For most older Catholics, praying the Stations of the Cross was a familiar tradition growing up. Fridays were the designated days for the Stations, but they could be prayed anytime during the Lenten period, and parishioners were encouraged to pray them in ordinary time, too.

The Stations of the Cross emanated from the ancient practice of pilgrimage. People known as “pilgrims” would make the long journey to the Holy Land on foot in hopes of unburdening themselves of sin so that they might receive the special graces attached to the land where Christ had walked. The final leg of the journey was to follow the Via Dolorosa, or Way of Sadness—the route that Jesus presumably took through Jerusalem to Calvary with his cross. It was this final stage of pilgrimage that led to the idea of the stations, or stops, that Jesus took along that “last sad street”.

In the 14th century, the Franciscans were given responsibility for the shrines of the Holy Land in order to greet pilgrims and provide pastoral care. However, not everyone could travel to the Holy Land, so the Friars would bring the Holy Land to Christians. They were responsible for popularizing and spreading this devotion. At Franciscan parishes and retreat centers, anyone unable to make an actual pilgrimage to the Holy Land was invited to symbolically journey through those fateful stops and make the same reparations and intercessions that other pilgrims made.

Our spiritual lives are a journey toward a greater understanding of God. By accompanying the passion of Jesus via the Stations of the Cross we can literally “move” toward spiritual wholeness.

Join us in praying the Stations beginning Friday, February 16, 7:00pm in Church, and then every Friday throughout Lent.

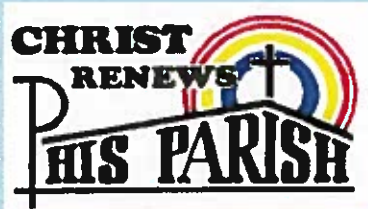

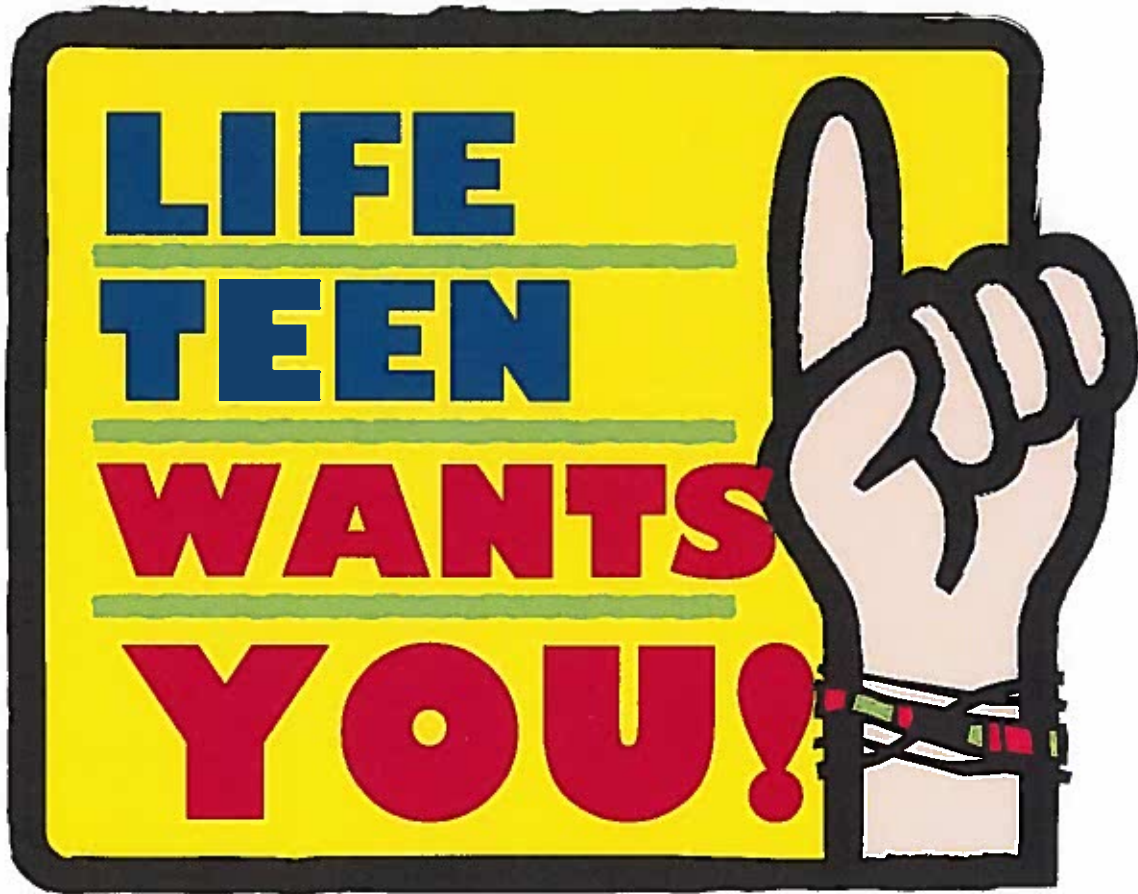

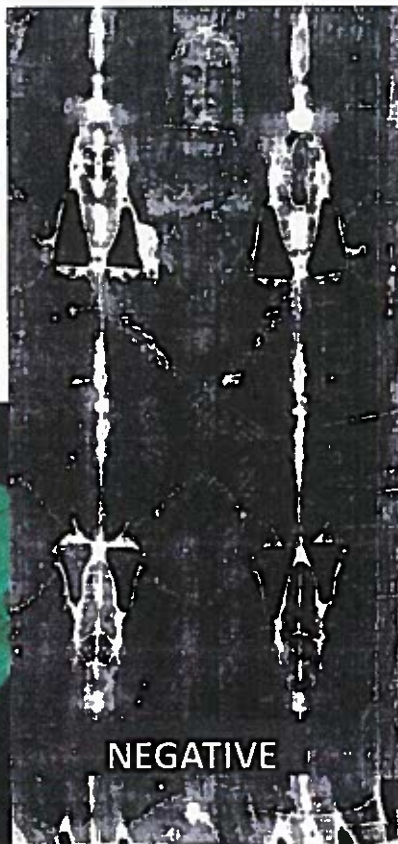
